


Art Exhibition/Vera Thornton - Saturday 8th June

Police & Crime Update – Clerk read latest Police & Crime Bulletin. Croft not featured. Rally Cross Car Crash outside the Croft Spa discussed. PC Wood is actively patrolling with the Speed Enforcement Camera. Clerk to get update for next meeting

North Yorkshire County Council & Richmondshire District Council Update — Clerk read update on behalf of Cllr Thompson; Parish Councils can purchase their own Matrix Boards. Guidance will soon be issued to all PCs s on how villages such as Croft could participate in a 'cooperative scheme' where Cllr Thompson will purchase a Matrix Board through his Environmental Budget, and circulate its use round a number of villages for 6 weeks at a time. There will be a cost to participating PCs, but this will be kept as low as possible. It is unsure if it is possible to use a Matrix Board on the A167, further investigations will be made. The road from Middleton Tyas will be a prime example of where the initiative will be of great use.

New Dog Waste location – unsure if new location is Public or Private land. Clerk to check with Cllr Chaytor-Norris

Litter Pick Update – RDC can provide litter picking tools/materials and collect the bin bags on arrangement. Suggested monthly litter pick, clerk to create small flyer and poster for notice board and arrange for advert in newsletter. Cllr Longstaff to implement flyer drop through village and be point of contact.

The first litter pick was held on Sunday 25^{th} August with seven volunteers aged 10 to 73 . Good job done by all.
